Parkhotel Quellenhof Aachen:
New favourite floor in a fresh design

Aachen, 27 March 2023. Delicate colours and noble materials create a pleasantly homely atmosphere. With her unique understanding of a stylish design, the renowned interior designer Anne Maria Jagdfeld has now created a refreshing, timelessly elegant ambience for the first rooms and suites at the Parkhotel Quellenhof Aachen.

"For me, the newly designed rooms and suites now have this unmistakable modern-classic style in the Jagdfeld design," explains Andreas Wieckenberg, General Manager of the Parkhotel Quellenhof Aachen. "The custom-made furniture and accessories iconically underline the incomparable character of the hotel." In 2020, the Quellenhof still presented itself as a house with 180 rooms, 52 of which were single rooms. "This is no longer contemporary today," explains the manager. "So we saw the opportunity to create a series of new unique suites for Aachen for the first time." For this purpose, rooms were harmoniously combined to form spacious, elegant junior or senior suites with separate living and sleeping areas as well as a bath and a separate shower room. In a first step, three junior and three senior suites with a modern and elegant design were created on the third floor in the past months, in addition to new feel-good rooms and the somewhat larger favourite rooms.

Bespoke creations

For the new rooms in the Parkhotel Quellenhof Aachen, the focus was primarily on custom-made furniture, fabrics and objects according to Jagdfeld's own design drafts, most of which were manufactured in selected manufactories in Europe. "The bed is one of the important quality features for the guest experience," emphasises Andreas Wieckenberg. Thus, all rooms of the Quellenhof were equipped with new box spring beds of the highest class for maximum sleeping comfort. The luxurious feather toppers were specially treated for allergy sufferers, as were the down duvets and pillows from the Mühldorfer manufacture.

The design of the headboards of the luxury beds played a special role in the design concept. They were created especially for the Parkhotel and impress not only in their dimensions but also with their special pattern and form language: elegantly curved, they are covered with a natural-coloured Herringbone linen and elaborately embroidered with floral patterns in delicate, shimmering shades of blue or sage green. To some viewers, the shape of the headboards is reminiscent of the silhouette of Charlemagne's throne in Aachen Cathedral, which can subliminally create a connection to the imperial city and its history. The respective colour palette of sage or bleu is also preserved in the seating furniture, but in more intense nuances. With their unusual feel, the tables, also designed exclusively for the Quellenhof, impress with a sand-coloured textile ray skin that forms a fascinating

sympiosis with the filigree table frame made of burnished brass. Anne Maria Jagdfeld sets special accents with her lighting concept. Instead of ceiling lights, which she deliberately avoids, decorative table and floor lamps with their warm light create an ambience of well-being. The luminaires from a French manufacturer are made of heavy, burnished brass and have light, plain-coloured lampshades. The room design is rounded off by works by a Berlin photographer. The stylised blossom and grass motifs create a harmonious connection between the design elements in the rooms and the location at the spa gardens.

Technical refinements

Special attention was also paid to the technical equipment. In addition to high-speed W-LAN and a Bluetooth connection right into the bathroom, inductive as well as wired charging options have been provided on the bedside table. Furthermore, all rooms at the Quellenhof now have the latest generation of "55" screen TVs. To ensure that business travellers can also enjoy maximum comfort, the new rooms were equipped with particularly large, stylish walnut desks with discreetly recessed power and USB connections.

Conserving resources and acting sustainably

"The changes at the Quellenhof have been made carefully," Andreas Wieckenberg concludes. "For example, we have retained the timeless, stately style and high-class materials in our bathrooms or supplemented them with exclusive Italian marble." In addition to energy-efficient lighting, care was also taken to ensure that the newly installed minibars are only switched on and stocked when the service is explicitly requested by the guest. The new room access cards also come from sustainable production, as do the biodegradable coffee capsules. Looking back, the director is particularly proud of one thing: "In keeping with our philosophy, we not only placed a lot of value on European materials and manufactory production, but also relied on numerous local companies, from carpenters to painters, for the conversion and renovation of the new 'favourite floor'."

The Parkhotel Quellenhof Aachen, opened in 1916, is located in the heart of the city, directly at the spa gardens.
